In addition to a degree in Sociology is a lecturer and writer in numerous forums.is physical by the Universidad Complutense de Madrid, and meteorologist, expert in climate scenarios, he was Director of the Program of Climate Change Analysis of AEMet (State Agency of Meteorology) until 2013 and Spanish delegate in the Committee of climatology of the World Meteorological Organization, from 1993 until 2013. Since 1989 he has worked with the IPCC working groups ("the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Climate Change of the United Nations), as an expert, in some cases, and as a delegate in others.

In 1988-91 he was co-director of the National Geographic Atlas - Climatology Group, published in 1991 by the National Center for Geographic Information and in 1990 coordinated the Spanish edition of the "First Assessment Report of the IPCC", in its complete version. Between 1990-92 he formed part of the Spanish delegation for the negotiation and drafting of the Framework Convention on Climate Change of the

United Nations, adopted at the Rio Summit in 1992 and from 1993 it is Permanent Delegate of Spain, in the Commission for Climatology of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO).

He has been a member of the working groups and committees that have developed national programs of I+D on climate and atmosphere and related activities of observation and has participated in the creation of the National System of Environmental Indicators, in the subsystem of atmosphere.

In addition, he is the author of numerous scientific, educational articles and chapters of books on climate change, and frequently collaborates in training activities, discussion, and dissemination of information on climate change and energy and is a member of the Advisory Committee of Ethics of the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT), created in April 2002. Without forgetting that this was a member of the Advisory Panel and the Technical Secretariat of the "Strategy of Andalusia in the face of Climate Change" until 2007.
