In his academic career has been until June 2006 UNESCO Professor of Territory and Environment of the Rey Juan Carlos University; Professor at the Monterey Institute of International Studies in California, of the Marshall-Wythe School of Law at the College of William and Mary (Virginia, USA) and Harvard Law School (Massachusetts, USA, 1990-1992). Founder and Former Director of the Environmental Law Section of the University Institute of Environmental Sciences-IUCA (Universidad Complutense de Madrid). Founder and first Director of the Real Colegio Complutense, established in cooperation with the University of Harvard University, 1989-1997.

Counsel of the Council of State (from July 1976 to July 2006). Former Director General of Nature Conservation of the Ministry of the Environment. Grand Prix Spatial and Urban Planning of the European Commission and the European Association of Landscape Architecture for his work with the University of Harvard, Complutense University and University of Castilla-La Mancha on the planning of the old part of the city of Toledo. Prize I Chair Miguel Mateo of Mexico for his work on the planning of natural environments of historical sets.

Among many other publications in Spanish, English, German and Japanese, can be highlighted: Environmental Law of the European Community (2 vols). Civitas. Madrid, 1993. Code of Environmental Legislation (along with Miguel Riano Pombo). BOE, 1994. Introduction to International Environmental Law: Cases and Materials with Handbook for American Lawyers (Friends of Thoreau-IUIEN, 2d ed., 2009), Dictionary of Environmental Law, Director and editor, with Blanca Lozano Cutanda, and author of many of the voices Ed Iustel, 2006. Currently is leading a collective work of more than thirty authors on Animal Welfare Legislation, enforcement and control, soon to be published, in 2010, by the Publications Service of the Ministry of the Environment and Rural and Marine Affairs and Editorial Iustel.
